And what about myself? Often, I am facing the contradiction in the two commitments taken in my new life (pension age) :

- my wish for a simple life of silence, prayer and opening, in the peace of the village where the Lord pitched my tent 47 years ago;
- and my declaration that "now, I am available".

Anyway, I manage my programme, trying to understand the "signs" I receive ! For instance, from May to December 2002, this was my itinerary :

- Cairo and Alexandria : meeting of our AFI West Asia unit;
- Damas : where Rafah invited me to attend a seminar (psychosomatic medicine), and the occasion to discover her country;
- two stays in Belgium where now I share the open and welcoming home of Francine and Jacques (my niece and nephew) at Rosieres;
- Lima and Huaraz (Peru), Santiago, Valparaiso ans Chiloé islands (Chile) where two of my nephews welcomed me. For this first visit in Latin America, they enabled me to understand a bit people's concern but also to discover the beauties of these countries;
- I made also a few trips within India, including to bid farewell to two close friends : Acharya Francis (ocso) and James Tombeur (SAM), two sincere witnesses of Love.

This year, we celebrate the birth centenary of Dr. Frans Hemerijckx. We remembered him at Polambakkam, Ninove and Grimbergen, with gratitude for all he has been in Congo (25 years) and India (10 years), not only for his patients but for all who shared his life.

At Polambakkam, a young tamilian lady, Victoria, joined me. She got involved in the existing social and educational activities and is preparing a Ph.D. thesis in sociology. She is also a precious help to welcome our guests and friends.

My AFI teammate, Huguette, from Mauritius, spent a good time with me. She was hoping to get active treatment for her eyes problems (there are renowned specialists in Madras). Unfortunately this has not been possible, but at least we could live long fraternal exchanges.

So you see why I speak of contradictory options ! Nevertheless, it has been a very enriching year.

May the Lord's hands be over you and all around you in the 2003 year !
